### MID SUMMER RENDEZVOUS GREAT OAK LANDING MARINA JULY 16-18, 2010

This was held at Great Oak Landing on beautiful Fairlee Creek on the above captioned dates. This was a very memorable event. A picnic style dinner event was held under a tent on the point as was the cocktail party the night before. The event was arranged by Fleet Captain Morrison who had to double time it and make alternate arrangements for another tent after the first vendor could not get the tent there a few days before the event.
